KPAP

Accomplishments:

In 2007, almost 2,000 porters were outfitted with proper mountain climbing gear through the KPAP office in Moshi.

Over 7,000 porters have attended KPAP sponsored classes in First Aid, conversational English, Money Management, and HIV/AIDS awareness since 2005.

30 porters and guides have been trained as Community-Based First Aid instructors.

The Kilimanjaro Porters Assistance Project (KPAP) is a Tanzanian NGO registered in January 2003 (www.kiliporters.org). KPAP is an initiative of the International Mountain Explorers Connection (IMEC), a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization based out of Boulder, Colorado (www.mountainexplorers.org). KPAP's mission is to help improve the working conditions of the porters on Kilimanjaro by:

- Lending donated clothing at no charge to the porters who carry loads on Kilimanjaro.
 - Providing free classes for the benefit of the porters, such as English, First Aid, HIV/AIDS Awareness, and Money Management.
 - Educating the public on the porter working conditions and providing Guidelines for Proper Porter Treatment.
