Mt. Rainier always presents a myriad of conditions, from very hot to very cold. Having the right equipment is paramount to your success. Below, you will find a detailed list of gear required for this climb. <u>Unless otherwise noted, all gear on this list is required.</u> Items that are available to rent are indicated, and feel free to browse our <u>rental department</u> for modern, high quality mountaineering equipment at a very reasonable price. <u>Please note that advanced reservations for rental equipment on Mt. Rainier is not required.</u>
