Mt. Shuksan can present a myriad of conditions, from very hot to very cold. Having the right equipment is paramount to your success. Below, you will find a detailed list of gear <u>required</u> for this climb, unless otherwise noted. Items that are available to rent are indicated, and can be reserved by completing and submitting the <u>Gear Rental Form</u>. <u>Rental forms are</u> <u>due no later than 2 weeks prior to the trip start date</u>. Forms submitted within 2 weeks of your program may not be fulfilled. Any available gear will be sent with your guides to meet you the first day of the program.

All programs include a detailed gear inspection with the lead guide. Please bring all the items listed and your guide will help you choose a weight conscious and conditions appropriate layering system. If you are choosing between multiple pieces of gear, bring both, and your guide will help you choose. Double boots may be required and are appropriate for all weather conditions on Mt. Shuksan. Full shank single boots may be acceptable for warm, fair-weather climbs in the middle of the summer. Please read our **Boot Blog** to understand the differences between boots.
